I am awake during the night (nocturnal).




I eat both meat and plants including fruit, mushrooms, insects and eggs (I am an omnivore).


ANIMAL NO. 2 CLUES

I hibernate during the winter.




I am a beetle with a red back and black spots.



Draw a line from the animal to the words.






Which hedgerow plants do these flowers and fruits belong to?

I have special flowers called catkins. Catkins are also known as lambs' tails because they look like long fluffy tails. I lose my leaves in winter so I am a deciduous plant.



I am the most common plant found in hedgerows. I have small white flowers in spring and bright red berries in autumn. I also have thorns to keep away


animals from eating my berries.




